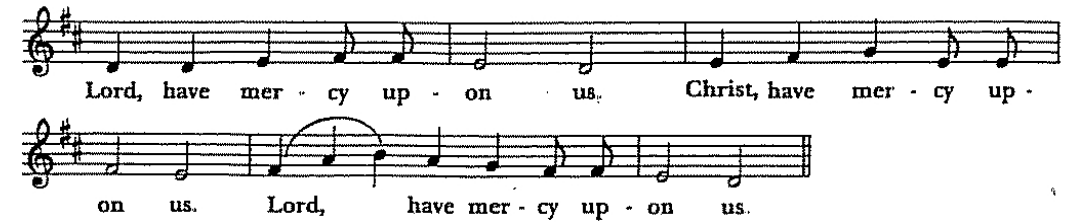
PRAYER OF CONFESSION


