HOW YOU CAN HELP

Dear Members of PCCH,

There will be a congregational meeting following worship **TODAY** with two important votes affecting the future of our church. In advance of the meeting, we wanted to provide you with information so that you will make every effort to be present and prayerfully consider your vote. First, as you may recall, we elected an Associate Pastor Nominating Committee at the last meeting of the congregation in February 2018 for the purpose of searching for an Associate Pastor for Youth and Senior Adults. We are pleased to announce that this search has been concluded and our nominee has been approved by the Committee on Ministry of the Presbytery. The Associate Pastor Nominating Committee is thrilled to nominate Brain Russo to be our Associate Minister for Youth and Senior Adult Ministry. As Brian is well-known to all of us through his ministry with us over the last ten years, a formal introduction is not required. The Associate Pastor Nominating Committee will be at the meeting if you have questions regarding this process or our selection. At the meeting, we will nominate Brian and the congregation will decide whether or not to call him to be our Associate Minister.

Second, we are continuing to move forward as we begin the process of finding a new head of staff because of Cindy's retirement. The Mission Study Committee has asked the congregation to reflect on who we are as a church and where we would like to go in the future through the CAT survey. The Mission Study Committee is expected to submit its report by early summer. While this work continues, the Session has decided that it is best for the congregation to elect the Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) before everyone scatters for the summer. The Nominating Committee, made up of representatives from the session, the deacons and the congregation at large, will place in nomination the names of members who are representative of the whole congregation and who have particular gifts for this important responsibility. Those names will be presented to the congregation at the May 20th congregational meeting where you will be invited to vote. It should be noted that until the Mission Study Report is submitted, the elected PNC will only engage in activities related to their internal organization and orientation to the pastoral search process. Members of the Nominating Committee and the Session will be present at the meeting if you have questions regarding this process.

Please join us on May 20th as we continue charting our future as a church.

GERMANTOWN AVENUE CRISIS MINISTRY: Next collection date is Sunday, June 3.

PCCH has been a long-time supporter of Germantown Avenue Crisis Ministry, not only through financial donations but also via volunteerism, holiday gift basket drives, and monthly donations to their food cupboard. We collect food cupboard donations the **first Sunday of each month** at the end of worship.

Each week, The GACM food cupboard supplies 50 - 60 households with packages that include both fresh and non-perishable foods. Using prescribed products and quantities, clients are invited into the cupboard to choose the items they need. Packages supply food for 3 days and may be received once within a 30- day period.

The goal is to provide food products with which families can provide complete meals; to this end, we will be asking our families to donate a pair of complementary items to help restock the cupboard. This month, the items are **peanut butter and jelly** (preferably in plastic jars) with which families can make sandwiches for school lunches. Each month, the Social Witness Committee, in conjunction with GACM, will let you know about the "pick-a-pair" items for that month. **Thank you again for your continuing support!**
