

### Dr. Russell Kauffman - The Creation of a New Drug and How They are Priced

Dr. Kaufman has been an academic leader in biomedicine for 35 years, serving as Chief of Hematology/ Oncology, Vice Dean, and Associate Vice Chancellor at Duke University, where he is an emeritus professor of Medicine and Biochemistry. After leaving Duke in 2002, he became President and CEO of The Wistar Institute in Philadelphia, from which he retired in March 2015 and is president emeritus. He now is Executive-in Residence for Pappas-Capital in North Carolina and founder of Kaufman LifeSciences. He will talk about drug development, starting from a basic science discovery, to developing a lead, through the different funding and research trial stages and finally FDA approval and naming. Then, he will discuss how a price for the drug is determined.
