

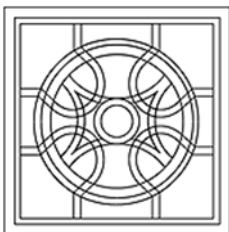

When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors were locked where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained."

But Thomas (who was called the Twin), one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe."

A week later his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe." Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe."

Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples that are not written in this book. But these are written so that you may continue to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name.

COVER ART *The Doubting of Thomas*, Mesrop of Xizan, illuminated manuscript, 1609. One of twenty-four illuminations in the *Armenian Gospel of 1609 Manuscripts*. *The Doubting of Thomas* depicts the moment Thomas touches the wounds of Jesus confirming that he is risen. This is one of the first works by Mesrop, and was part of a commission from a priest named Khachatur. Each of the illuminations have a brief description written under the image. The description found under this illustration says “again on the second Sunday Christ appeared to Thomas and said: ‘Bring your finger and put it in my side and see the mark of the spear.’ And Thomas saw it and believed and worshiped him on the ground.”

Commonwealth Youth Choir ("CYC") was founded in 2001, and for many years thrived with two main programs, the Keystone State Boychoir and the Pennsylvania Girlchoir. In 2024, these programs and the Philadelphia Boys and Girls Choirs announced a joint venture, and the Keystone State Boychoir and Pennsylvania Girlchoir combined forces to become the allgender Commonwealth Youth Choir. Commonwealth Youth Choir empowers nearly 200 young singers from across the Greater Philadelphia region to find their voice—to express themselves boldly, and to strive for excellence—in rehearsal, on the stage and as a member of the community. Every week, young people between the ages of six and eighteen from throughout the region come together at the Presbyterian Church of Chestnut Hill to make music and share life experiences with highly skilled and experienced music educators. CYC has sung for Popes, Presidents, and Nobel Prize winners, both at home and across the globe, having performed on all seven continents! Audition information can be found by scanning the QR Code.
