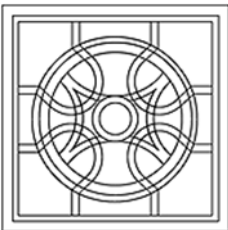



**COVER ART** *Pericopes Book of Henry II: images 236 and 237*, commissioned by Holy Roman Emperor Henry II, c. 1007-1012, illuminated manuscript. The Pericopes Book of Henry II is an elaborate illuminated manuscript depicting the Gospel stories, most famous for its miniatures, decorated initials and ornate ivory carved cover. Image 236 and 237 lay side by side and show when "the Marys" enter the tomb and are told Jesus has risen. Art historians learn that color can be more important in understanding religious art than the literal representation of the subject. White represents purity and holiness; green rebirth, creation and hope; purple royalty and majesty; blue heaven and divine light; yellow divinity and the light and presence of God. Using just color theory one can denote that the women embody hope, divine light, and rebirth; while the angel (in pure white) is wrapped (quite literally) in the light and presence of God (yellow).
