

***Backpacks for Philadelphia Interfaith Hospitality Network.*** Please fill one (or more) child-sized backpacks with school supplies. These backpacks are distributed to children within PIHN's program to assist those dealing with transitional homelessness.

***School supplies for Community Partnership School.*** An independent school in North Philadelphia committed to providing a high-quality education to children and their families from surrounding neighborhoods.

Supplies: Hand sanitizer (any size container); cleaning wipes; individual packages of crayons, markers, colored pencils, No. 2 pencils, scissors, glue sticks, composition notebooks. Donated funds will be used to purchase microphones for the faculty. If we return to remote learning, we will be purchasing Wi-Fi hotspots for families without Internet access.

***Pantry supplies for Germantown Avenue Crisis Ministry and PIHN.*** Shelf-stable pantry items (no glass please!) including hearty soups, pasta, rice, canned meat and fish, and vegetables. PIHN is also in need of feminine hygiene products for women and teens.
