



PCCH STEEPLE WORK SCHEDULED

Work on our steeple began on Monday, August 21 and will continue for the next 2-3 weeks. We ask that everyone participate in keeping PCCH and the construction workers safe by maintaining an awareness of your surroundings when entering or exiting PCCH's driveways, reducing speeds, and maintaining a safe distance from all construction equipment and activities. 
