

## JOHN WILKINSON RECEIVES LILLY ENDOWMENT GRANT

While still in Rochester, John received a grant from the Lilly Endowment/Louisville Institute. Called a Pastoral Study Project grant, John proposed visiting several congregations for site visits to learn how congregations engage in mission in their communities. One move later, plus a pandemic, John will undertake these visits over the next few weeks. Each visit will include a four-day "immersion" in the life of a congregation, including worship, special events, committees and interviews. 
