#### **EPISTLE LESSON**





"The experience of doing Donte's portrait has been different from the others I have done for SSPP. This time it was personal. I knew Donté Johnson. I interviewed him in 2018 when I did his brother Charles' portrait. His family now treats me like a member.

Donté had spoken at the opening of the third exhibition reception for Souls Shot Portrait Project in November 2019. I remember him speaking so eloquently about the family members, brother, and friends he had lost to gun violence. "I am an endangered species," he said.

That evening I went to thank him for a wonderful speech. After he gathered me into one of his bear hugs, he graciously accepted my thanks. As he gathered his children and hurried them out, he turned to me and asked, "So, you'll do my portrait, right?""

"Donté Lee Johnson was an exceptionally intelligent, sensitive and kind person. He was the type of child that would cry if he saw a lone kitten on the street because it didn't have a mommy. When Donté was almost two years old a distinguishing gray patch in the shape of a heart formed on the front right side of his hair. Donté was a loyal and dependable friend, loving son and amazing father to his daughter Jaiyana and son Saabir.

Donté Lee Johnson was the second oldest child of gun violence prevention activist Movita Johnson-Harrell and stood on the front line with his family for a decade fighting gun violence after his younger brother Charles was killed. Donté was on a weekend trip to California when he was shot and killed in a drive-by shooting. His loss is heartbreaking for his family, the city, and the gun violence prevention community nationally."

PCCH continues its tradition of helping our neighbors have enough for Thanksgiving, as those in need continue to be disproportionately affected by the economic effects of the pandemic. We will be collecting food donations for Germantown Avenue Crisis Ministry's Thanksgiving basket program through this Sunday, November 14. They are hoping to serve over 100 households.

Please bring your food donations to church (Sundays or during the week) in **reusable shopping bags** (supporting GACM's efforts to use reusable bags) or make a donation (\$45, the suggested cost of goods for a family) via the church, noting "GACM" on the memo line. Please leave turkeys/chickens in the kitchen freezer.

Here's a list of suggested food items:

Meat: Turkey, turkey breast, roasting chicken

Starch: rice, mashed potatoes, yams, macaroni and cheese, corn stuffing

Vegetables: green beans, green peas

Bread: rolls, corn bread mix

Dessert: cake mix, icing, cookie mix, jello, pie crust, pie filling

Other: gravy, cranberry sauce, seasonings, sugar, flour, juice, iced tea, canned milk


