



TALLIS' CANON

COVER ART *Massive star-forming region in 30 Doradus*, 2022. Credit: image–NASA, ESA, Elena Sabbi (ESA, STScI), acknowledgment–Robert O'Connell (UVA), SOC-WFC3. The Hubble space telescope captured this image of the massive young stellar grouping R136. The cluster of stars resides in the 30 Doradus nebula, a turbulent star birth region in the large Magellanic Cloud, a satellite galaxy of our Milky Way. The blue color is light from the hottest, most massive stars; the green from the glow of oxygen; and the red from fluorescing hydrogen. This nearby stellar nursery provides insights into the star life cycle and how star clusters may have formed in the early universe.

CHILDREN'S MINISTRY NEWS

Partway through worship, the children are invited to come forward for a children's moment. After that, children through grade 7 will proceed to the Strouse Education Building (church school wing) for church school. Church School classes include a visual story and time for the children to create, read, and play!

Joyful Noise, the musical component of our children's ministry, meets weekly in the chapel immediately following Church School on Sunday mornings, concluding at 11:40 a.m. The children will sing in worship once each month. All children through grade 5 are invited to participate.

Youth Choir rehearses weekly on Sundays from 4:30–5:00 p.m. and sings in worship once each month. All youth in grades 6-12 are invited to participate. Please note that beginning in January 2023 we will have a 45-minute rehearsal time and will move our start time to 4:15 p.m.

Nursery care is available for children ages two and under and is staffed by two fully vaccinated, fully background-checked adults. Nursery workers will continue wearing masks.

CALLING ALL KIDS

All children ages 3 through grade 5 who like to sing are invited to join Joyful Noise, our children's choir, as they rehearse and perform the musical *Who Built the Ark*?, based on the



Old Testament story of Noah. Children who participate will gain confidence, musical and theatrical skills, and an understanding of the relevance of Noah's story to their lives. Church attendance is not required for participation, and friends are welcome to join us.

Rehearsals will take place on Sundays from 11:10 a.m.-12:10 p.m. (children who are not yet in kindergarten will be dismissed at 11:40 a.m.). Rehearsal dates: January 8–May 7 (no rehearsal February 5 and 12 and April 9).


