




COVER ART Giacomo Cavedone, *The Prophet Isaiah, Chiesa di San Benedetto*, Bologna, Italy. Cavedone (1577-1660) was an Italian Baroque painter of the Bolognese School. He studied with both Guido Reni and Ludovico Carracci, succeeding the latter as head of the Accademia degli Incamminati ("Academy of Those who are Making Progress"). But his career as a painter was cut short by a set of misfortunes, including a 1623 fall from a church scaffold and the deaths in 1630 of his wife and children from the plague. The 1911 Britannica (in which he is incorrectly called Jacopo Cavendone) claims his wife was accused of witchcraft. He died in poverty.

This program will focus on sleep and its effect on our bodies. We spend 1/3 of our lives asleep, so sleep is very significant. The National Academy of Medicine has declared lack of sleep today as a public health problem in America. Sleep deprivation can and does affect many of us as we age. The highlights of the program will focus on the general symptoms of a sleep problem, and most important, some tips on how to achieve a "good" night's sleep.

The award-winning documentary film *How Saba Kept Singing* shares the story of cantor, Holocaust survivor, and military veteran David S. Wisnia (age 93) who spends his later years travelling with his grandson and musical accompanist, Avi Wisnia (age 38), sharing the story of how he survived the Holocaust through music which the duo perform together. For years, cantor Wisnia's story centered around the belief that he survived Auschwitz mainly by using his beautiful singing voice to entertain his Nazi captors. These performances in the death camp gave him status as a "privileged prisoner." However, when David takes his family back to Poland for one last performance, Avi starts asking questions and they discover that someone else had a hand in Saba's survival. An uplifting story about music, faith, family and resilience, proving love can grow and take hold in even the darkest of places. This film is directed by Sara Taksler (*Tickling Giants*), with Hillary Rodham Clinton and Chelsea Clinton, executive producers.

Avi Wisnia will be joining us to perform some of "Saba's Songs" on piano and to lead a Q & A session following the film. Avi is an award-winning singer, songwriter, storyteller, and educator based in Philadelphia. He performs in venues around the world including the Hammerstein Ballroom in New York and the Kennedy Center in D.C., with concert tours in Japan, Poland, and Brazil.


