





#### MANDER ORGAN UPDATE

One of the most vital components of a pipe organ is the blower. This is the device that supplies the wind enabling the pipes to sound. It's an electrically powered turbine that maintains a steady wind supply for the organ. Last month, the blower on our organ malfunctioned and we were told that it was rapidly failing. Thankfully, a temporary fix got us through the Christmas season. This past Wednesday, the blower was removed and taken to Reading Electric where it will be rebuilt. The cost for this work is extra-budgetary; a firm estimate will not be calculated until the blower has been disassembled. We will be without the organ for approximately one month. Our Mander organ is now 24 years old, and it is expected that the instrument will need other necessary repairs in the coming years due to age and use.

### SUNDAY SCHOOL UPDATE

We offer classes for two different age groups—one for children ages 3 through  $2^{nd}$  grade (room 212) and another for children in grades 3 through 7 (room 201). Both rooms are directly adjacent to the chapel.

Our curriculum for both age groups, based on the Montessori method of learning, comes from Godly Play, using visual elements to hear Bible stories and then inviting children to express themselves by creating art or building and shaping things.

Godly Play is designed for children to both experience God and to find ways to express their faith experiences. The rhythm of Godly Play is more like worship than school and children are able to explore what they have experienced.

Our younger children from ages 3 to  $2^{nd}$  grade will be immersed in the stories of God's care for us, learning the ebb and flow of silence and interacting, of hearing and doing.

The older group, grades 3 to 7, will focus on the gift of creation and how we might think about the needs of the earth while hearing many ways in which people of the Bible carry out acts of love and care in challenging times.

Nursery care is available for children ages two and under and is staffed by two fully vaccinated, fully background-checked adults. Nursery workers will continue wearing masks.

The City of Philadelphia played a leading role in the political, cultural, and commercial development of the young United States. Less well-known is the role the city played in scientific studies. This program will look at Philadelphia's scientific contribution through the work of Alexander Wilson (the father of American ornithology), and John James Audubon. The city provided the atmosphere and resources for these two remarkable, self-taught naturalists to make a distinctly American contribution to science, and to bring American science to the attention of the people of the United States and to the leading scientists of Europe.

Chris Petrak, a native of Detroit, studied at Wayne State University, and at Princeton Seminary. He lived for twenty years in a 200 year old farm/village home in southeastern Vermont where he pent as much time as possible watching, studying, and photographing birds in the fields, forests, back roads, and mountain trails of the Green Mountain State.


