

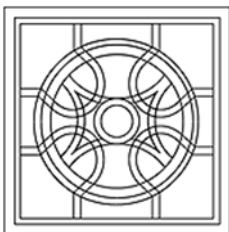

OLD TESTAMENT

1 Samuel 16:1-13

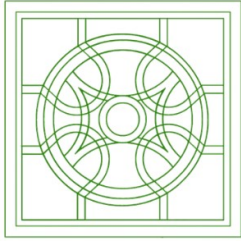

Samuel Anointing David, Unknown, wall painting, 3rd century. In the 1930's a team of archeologists discovered a Jewish synagogue at Dura-Europos, Syria. Before the town was destroyed by Persia around 257 AD the synagogue was filled with sand and dirt to help fortify the city walls from the advancing armies. It was this backfilling that preserved the primary structure of the synagogue, and the original wall paintings which are now in the National Museum of Damascus in Syria.
