




The *Zubdat al-Tawarikh* (translated to *Cream of Histories*) is a historical manuscript created in the Ottoman empire. Based on fifteenth century examples, the *Zubdat al-Tawarikh* was created to illustrate their dynasty's descent from the prophet Muhammad. This is one of forty illustrations in this manuscript and shows Hazqiyal (Ezekiel) raising the dead; as written in the Quran 2:243 and in Ezekiel 37.


