

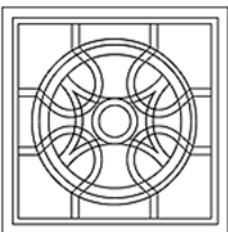


## PRAYER OF CONFESSION

Matthew 21:1-11

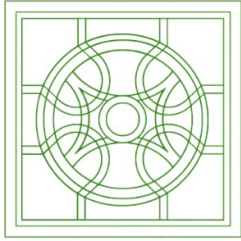
