

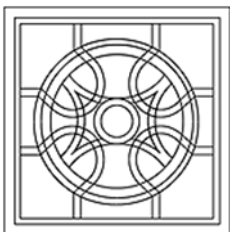

NEW TESTAMENT

Acts 2:1-21

When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

Now there were devout Jews from every people under heaven living in Jerusalem. And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. EPISTLE

1 Corinthians 12:3-13

Therefore I want you to understand that no one speaking by the Spirit of God ever says “Let Jesus be cursed!” and no one can say “Jesus is Lord” except by the Holy Spirit.

Now there are varieties of gifts but the same Spirit, and there are varieties of services but the same Lord, and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. 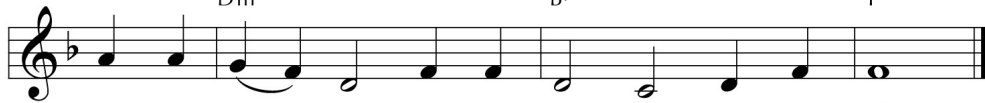





COVER ART *The Descent of the Holy Spirit*, Titian, oil on canvas, 1545. Triangles have been used in artistic representation to provide visual structure and order to imagery. In this canvas by Titian, the Holy Spirit (represented by the dove) is placed at the pinnacle, as the focus of the image. The dove's wings, and rays of light, radiate the focus to the people gathered. By keeping the female figures central Titian reinforces the idea that "All of them [women included] were filled with the Holy Spirit...as the Spirit gave them ability." Acts 2:3. This painting currently resides behind the alter of Basilica Santa Maria della Salute, in Venice, Italy.

TODAY'S FLOWERS FOR PENTACOST

Today's arrangements in red, yellow and orange symbolize the Pentacostal flames that appeared to the Apostles and other followers of Jesus fifty days after the resurrection. The apostles had gathered to celebrate the feast of the Summer Harvest. A great wind was heard and what looked like flames appeared on the heads of the disciples and each began to speak in tongues. This presence of the Holy Spirit is seen to mark the Christian church's mission to the world.
