

**Speaker: Drew Brown**

**Topic:** *Philadelphia's consolidation of 1854 and how it led to us drinking the Schuylkill River*

On a single day in 1854, Philadelphia was transformed from a County with twenty-nine separate and unique municipalities into a Consolidated County composed of one, new, all-encompassing City of Philadelphia that we know today. In a presentation illustrated with historic photographs

and original, hand-drawn engineering sketches from the Historical Collection of the City of Philadelphia Water Department, you will recognize scenes that you may never have connected to the water system, starting with Chestnut Hill's Water Tower, not just a monument but an essential component of water delivery in Chestnut Hill beginning in 1849.

*Drew Brown speaks regularly about the City of Philadelphia Water Department's current and historic operations. He is a civil/environmental engineer with more than forty years of experience with the Water Department. Not a native of Philadelphia, he says that the Water Department's history has been a fascinating framework for exploring the City's people and their neighborhoods. He lives in Chestnut Hill with his wife and two of his three adult children.*
