



**COVER ART** Marc Chagall, *America Windows* (detail), 1977, stained glass. © 2018 Artists Rights Society (ARS), New York / ADAGP, Paris. At the end of World War II, Marc Chagall (1887-1985) sought new avenues for artistic experimentation and turned to the medium of stained glass, which allowed him to explore intense color on a monumental scale. Working with master stained-glass maker Charles Marq, he executed 86 windows across Europe, Israel, and the United States. *America Windows* presents an unusual secular theme in his oeuvre, merging symbols of American history, the Chicago skyline, and the arts; reading from left to right, the panels represent music, painting, literature, architecture, theater, and dance. Chagall dedicated his work to Mayor Richard J. Daley, a great supporter of public art projects in the city, with whom he had worked on *The Four Seasons* mosaic at Chase Tower Plaza.

## Excerpts from "Renew a Right Spirit, Part I" (John Wilkinson, November 13, 2022)

# Create in me a clean heart, O God; and renew a right spirit within me.

## –Psalm 51

Over these past weeks these words of Psalm 51 have been our theme, providing a focus, a vision, and a direction.

You've heard members talking in compelling ways. You've read words and seen images about renewal, about that vision of a right spirit. We have been very clear about the straight-line connection between that vision and the call to support it financially.

# But always it's been the vision Renew a right spirit

So what does this have to do-at all-with stewardship?

What does it mean for how we respond with our financial gifts to support the mission and ministry of the church, of this church?

Over the course of the fall, and again today, you've seen and experienced the elements of what renewal looks like—

It's **ministry** supporting the faith development of our children, youth, families and adults, of their hearts and minds and souls.

It's music and arts which inspire and challenge us.

It's **social witness**, what we call our outreach, our mission, that seeks to meet the immediate needs of our neighbors though food and clothing and whose longer-term vision is to address the root causes that created those needs in the first place.

What I hope we can get is that this budget is at best a reflection of our values and priorities, and for us, a reflection of that call for renewal.

## Simply put-that renewal costs money.

## And at the same time—our landscape is changing.

There are fewer of us pledging. If you've pledged in the past, please consider doing it again. Some of you give generously, yet without pledging. If you can make that shift, that would help us in our planning. Some of you have not and do not pledge. Would you be open to that invitation, supporting this vision of renewal and all that it takes to make it happen?

We all know the narrative.

The decline of religion. Cynicism. Other choices to make. Generational disinterest.

And yet here we are—with a vision for renewal.

I believe this vision for renewal matters to each of us and all of us, and more so, I believe it matters as it spills out from this place to all the places that are hungry for hope and love and the kind of grace our new favorite psalm outlines.

God is creating new things all the time. I believe that.

And I believe that we are called by God to be the vehicles, the vessels, for that renewal, in the lives we live, in the things we support, and yes, in and through this church.

I believe that.

## CHILDREN'S MINISTRY NEWS

Partway through worship, the children are invited to come forward for a children's moment. After that, children through grade 7 will proceed to the Strouse Education Building (church school wing) for church school. Church School classes include a visual story and time for the children to create, read, and play!

**Joyful Noise**, the musical component of our children's ministry, meets weekly in the chapel immediately following Church School on Sunday mornings, concluding at 11:40 a.m. The children will sing in worship once each month. All children through grade 5 are invited to participate.

**Youth Choir**, under the direction of Julie Snyder, will meet this year at a new time, Sundays from 4:30–5:00 p.m. All youth in grades 6-12 are invited to participate.

**Nursery care** is available for children ages two and under and is staffed by two fully vaccinated, fully background-checked adults. Nursery workers will continue wearing masks.

## CALLING ALL KIDS

All children ages 3 through grade 5 who like to sing are invited to join Joyful Noise, our children's choir, as they rehearse and perform the musical *Who Built the Ark*?, based on the



Old Testament story of Noah. Children who participate will gain confidence, musical and theatrical skills, and an understanding of the relevance of Noah's story to their lives. Church attendance is not required for participation, and friends are welcome to join us.

Rehearsals will take place on Sundays from 11:10 a.m.–12:10 p.m. (children who are not yet in kindergarten will be dismissed at 11:40 a.m.). Rehearsal dates: January 8–May 7 (no rehearsal 2/5, 2/12, 4/9.)

Performance date: Sunday, May 14 at 10:00 a.m. during the worship service. Scan the QR code to register. Deadline to register is January 2.


