




The Presbyterian Church of Chestnut Hill has committed itself to be a Matthew 25 congregation, joining an initiative of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) focused on three areas:

Building congregational vitality, dismantling structural racism, eradicating systemic poverty.

This song, that many of us learned several decades ago, is true, of course.

At the same time, a church building can represent much more than the bricks and mortar that comprise it.

At the Presbyterian Church of Chestnut Hill, our building is both a gathering place and a sending place.

We are grateful that it is in good shape, dry and warm and well-maintained.

But we don't take any of that for granted.

And caring for our building has grown increasingly expensive, particularly in this COVID era.

For 2022, we are budgeted to spend \$50,000 from our operating funds on basic maintenance and regular repairs. That doesn't include additional funds taken from endowments and special gifts to pay for extra-budgetary projects. In 2022, we have invested in our heating and cooling system, our alarm system, our fire protection system. We have repaired significant leaks in the steeple and crumbling stonework in our Memorial Garden.

Also in 2022, we have budgeted \$54,500 for utilities, an increase of approximately 10%, with costs anticipated to increase in 2023.

Some of our building costs are offset by building usage fees from partner groups and outside groups. But as you might imagine, many not-for-profits are facing their own budgetary squeezes, and some have not come back at all, or fully, in this post-pandemic season.

To preserve our beautiful sanctuary, to keep Widener Hall as a lovely gathering place, to have Sunday school classrooms and offices and meeting rooms, to maintain our organ and pianos, to keep our parking lots clear of snow and our heating and cooling systems running—all of it takes money.

Here's the bottom line—
our building matters,
and while it's in very good shape, and well cared-for and maintained,
doing that work takes money.

The church is not a building, of course – it's the people and the mission.

Yet this building, which means so much to so many, is a place where the people can gather to do the mission of the church, our worship and fellowship and service.

CHILDREN, YOUTH & FAMILIES

SUNDAY SCHOOL UPDATE

We offer classes for two different age groups—one for children ages 3 through 2nd grade (room 212) and another for children in grades 3 through 7 (room 201). Both rooms are directly adjacent to the chapel.

Our curriculum for both age groups, based on the Montessori method of learning, comes from Godly Play, using visual elements to hear Bible stories and then inviting children to express themselves by creating art or building and shaping things.

Godly Play is designed for children to both experience God and to find ways to express their faith experiences. The rhythm of Godly Play is more like worship than school and children are able to explore what they have experienced.

Our younger children from ages 3 to 2nd grade will be immersed in the stories of God's care for us, learning the ebb and flow of silence and interacting, of hearing and doing.

The older group, grades 3 to 7, will focus on the gift of creation and how we might think about the needs of the earth while hearing many ways in which people of the Bible carry out acts of love and care in challenging times.

Nursery care is available for children ages two and under and is staffed by two fully vaccinated, fully background-checked adults. Nursery workers will continue wearing masks.


