




FLOWERS IN THE SANCTUARY are given to the glory of God and in loving memory of **Imogene T. Evans and J. Philip Evans** by Debby and Jack Evans and family.

COVER ART John Everett Millais, *Victory O Lord!*, 1871, Manchester Art Gallery, Manchester, England. Millais (1829-1896) was an English painter and illustrator who became the most famous exponent of the Pre-Raphaelite Brotherhood, a movement he co-founded. A child prodigy, at age 11 Millais was the youngest student to enter the Royal Academy Schools. In this work, a major turning point in his career, the artist depicts the going down of the sun when Moses, Aaron, and Hur watch the final moments of the battle of Rephidim. Moses is in the middle while Aaron (in red) and Hur hold up his arms to ensure victory. The battle below is indicated by the arrow at the bottom right. Millais worked on the painting over many years, scraping and repainting the surface. It has been suggested that the picture may refer to a prefiguration of the crucifixion as a scene in which arms raised and outstretched signify both physical suffering and triumph.


