




NEW TESTAMENT LESSON

COVER ART Caravaggio, *Conversion on the Way to Damascus*, oil on canvas, 1601, Cerasi Chapel, church of Santa Maria del Popolo, Rome. Michelangelo Merisi da Caravaggio (1571– 1610), known simply as Caravaggio, was an Italian painter active in Rome for most of his artistic life. Caravaggio combined close physical observation with a dramatic use of chiaroscuro that came to be known as tenebrism, where forms in paintings emerge from a dark background with usually one source of stark light, creating dramatic effects with its strong contrasts. Here the dramatic lighting evokes the moment of Saul's spiritual epiphany. Caravaggio's profound influence on Baroque painting can be seen in the works of Rubens, Bernini, and Rembrandt, among others. The 20th-century art historian André Berne-Joffroy states: "What begins in the work of Caravaggio is, quite simply, modern painting."




