

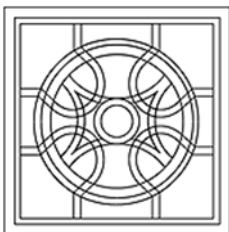

GOSPEL

John 4:5-10, 19-26

So he came to a Samaritan city called Sychar, near the plot of ground that Jacob had given to his son Joseph. Jacob's well was there, and Jesus, tired out by his journey, was sitting by the well. It was about noon.

A Samaritan woman came to draw water, and Jesus said to her, "Give me a drink." (His disciples had gone to the city to buy food.) The Samaritan woman said to him, "How is it that you, a Jew, ask a drink of me, a woman of Samaria?" (Jews do not share things in common with Samaritans.) Jesus answered her, "If you knew the gift of God and who it is that is saying to you, 'Give me a drink,' you would have asked him, and he would have given you living water."

The woman said to him, "Sir, I see that you are a prophet. Our ancestors worshiped on this mountain, but you say that the place where people must worship is in Jerusalem." You worship what you do not know; we worship what we know, for salvation is from the Jews. But the hour is coming and is now here when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth, for the Father seeks such as these to worship him. God is spirit, and those who worship him must worship in spirit and truth." The woman said to him, "I know that Messiah is coming" (who is called Christ). "When he comes, he will proclaim all things to us." Jesus said to her, "I am he, the one who is speaking to you."

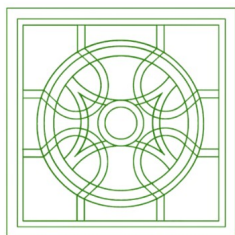

COVER ART

Christ Pantocrator, Hermann Schaper, mosaic, 1895. Built by Kaiser Wilhelm II in honor of his grandfather Kaiser Wilhelm I, Kaiser-Wilhelm-Gedachtnis-Kirche is a neo-Romanesque style church designed by Franz Schwechten. The original church was dedicated in 1895, with its completion occurring in 1906. In November of 1943 the original church was severely damaged during an air raid by Allied forces, leaving just the bell tower, baptistry, altar and entrance hall remaining standing. Following World War II there was debate over whether the church should be restored, or demolished and rebuilt. The initial plan of tearing down the spire caused public outrage with locals claiming that the belltower was the “heart of Berlin.” The plan was revised to preserve the tower, but had the remaining, damaged, structure torn down and built anew.

Christ Pantocrator is one of the remaining mosaics of the old tower vestibule, which now stands as a war memorial. Cracks were patched to keep the mosaics and structure from crumbling, but none of the ornamentation was replaced. Consideration was made, when restoring the old church, to leave the existing damage as a reminder of the “destruction of war and resilience of Berlin.”
